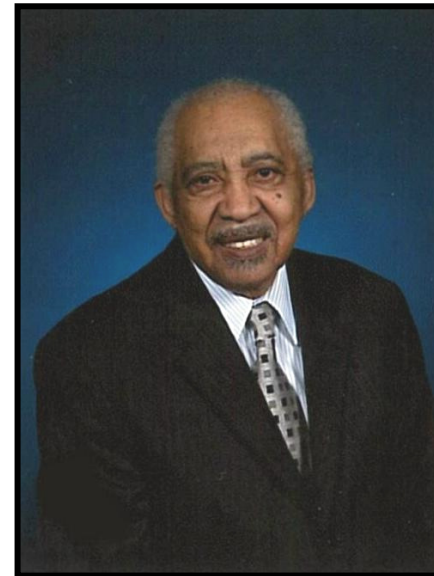

THE OBITUARY

Deacon Charles T. Woodson, Jr. of Glen Allen, Virginia was born on February 4, 1929.
